Endowment Act Funds Project Summary and Analysis

<u>Project Title</u>: Endowment Act – Treatment Training

Applicants: 5 applicants in 5 counties

Project Duration: January 1, 2016 – December 31, 2016

Project Description:

On June 17, 2015, the Office of Research, Evaluation, and Strategic Policy Development (ORESPD) at PCCD announced the availability of state Endowment Act (Act 1 of 2013) Funds. Act 1 outlines five categories which are eligible for funding for the benefit of the residents of the Commonwealth. For the purposes of this funding announcement, the following four categories were opened:

- (i) Programs or projects assisting the victims of child sexual abuse.
- (ii) Child Advocacy Centers (CACs).
- (iii) Victim service organizations that provide services to children subjected to sexual abuse.
- (iv) Training of persons who treat victims of child sexual abuse.

The Endowment Act – Treatment Training solicitation focused on providing funding to support the training of persons who treat victims/survivors of child sexual abuse. Applicants were eligible to apply for up to \$75,000 for training costs or up to \$150,000 to provide a statewide training and technical assistance component for one nationally recognized evidence-based, trauma-focused program or practice. Funding under this category was limited to supporting:

- (i) Training that will help medical and mental health providers who treat victims/survivors of child sexual abuse meet National Children's Alliance (NCA) accreditation standards.
- (ii) Evidence-based training for health care providers who treat victims/survivors of child sexual abuse.
- (iii) A statewide training and technical assistance component for a nationally recognized evidence-based, trauma-focused program/practice for children who have been sexually abused.

Staff Analysis and Recommendation:

In response to this solicitation, ORESPD received 9 applications requesting a total of \$653,992. The following table was prepared to provide highlights from the applications being recommended for funding. Staff is currently in the process of reviewing each application being recommended to ensure compliance with the requirements set forth in the funding announcement.

The Children's Advocacy Center Advisory Committee and Staff are recommending approval of these 5 applications requesting \$287,798 in Endowment Act Funds pending the resolution of outstanding programmatic and fiscal concerns.
