2022 SHERIFF AND DEPUTY SHERIFF BASIC TRAINING

(UPDATED 11/21)

The Basic Training schedule for 2022 is provided below. These dates are contingent on approval of training contracts. To be in compliance with Act 1984-2 as amended by Act 2014-114, any deputy hired by the sheriff has one year in which to complete his or her training and be certified by the Sheriff and Deputy Sheriff Education and Training Board (SDSETB). In addition, newly elected or appointed sheriffs are required to complete certification training in accordance with the Training Act.

Sheriffs are required to utilize the on-line enrollment process available through the Sheriff and Deputy Sheriff Information System (SDSIS). Accessing the SDSIS will assist your office in better management of your training needs and requirements. You will have instant access to your deputies training records and the ability to monitor their training status. The SDSIS web address is https://www.pccddsis.pa.gov.

Deputies must have current certification in First Aid and CPR prior to enrollment in Basic Training. Documentation must be uploaded in the SDSIS. Any nationally recognized training/certification will be accepted.

In addition, sheriffs and deputies that attend the Basic Training Academy are required to complete three additional on-line training courses for certification. These are the required courses:

- 1. <u>Introduction to Incident Command for Law Enforcement (IS-100LE)</u>, offered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), registration available at https://training.fema.gov/is/courseoverview.aspx?code=IS-100.c.
- 2. <u>National Incident Command (IS-700)</u>, offered by FEMA, registration available at http://training.fema.gov/EMIWeb/IS/is700a.asp.
- 3. <u>All Hazards (Module 1 Hazmat/WMD Awareness and Module 2 Security Threat Groups)</u>, SDSETB sponsored and offered by Temple University.





Sheriff and Deputy Sheriff Education and Training Board

The Waiver Training Academy will be conducted in a revised format beginning in 2022. The Waiver Training will consist of 40 hours of on-line training through Temple University and 40 hours (1 week) of residential "inclass" training at Penn State University. Sheriffs and deputies will be required to complete the on-line training prior to being eligible to be enrolled and attend the residential portion of the Waiver Training. More information will follow.

To access the on-line training courses offered by Temple University, sheriffs and deputies are required to create their own individual access to the SDSIS. The following link is for the SDSIS Login User Guide:


After creating access to the SDSIS, PCCD will authorize Temple University to enroll the sheriff or deputy in the online training courses. Temple University will send an email to each sheriff and deputy with instructions to access the online training.

2022 Basic Training Courses

B-22-01	January 10, 2022 – May 20, 2022	Penn State, University Park
B-22-02	July 11, 2022 – November 18, 2022	Penn State, University Park

County administrators are required to upload current first aid and CPR certifications into the Sheriff and Deputy Sheriff Information System (SDSIS) for the student to be eligible for enrollment in basic training. If the documents are not uploaded the student will not appear in the enrollment field as eligible.


Certification documents can be uploaded by selecting the "FA/CPR for Basic" Tab on the left panel of the individual students SDSIS page. This is somewhat different from the Waiver Training requirement and does not require staff approval before allowing enrollment.



Once selected, the tab will take you to a screen where you can upload the required certifications.

Once those documents are added, the student will be eligible for enrollment in a basic academy class.
